Preface

All the signs of this Astrology Book for 2010 are presented in this single volume, so that the reader can look up the sign of the year, month, day and hour in order to get a more complete reading. For example, someone may be born in the first month, third day, and eleventh hour of the year of the Dragon. By looking at the following Astrological Tables chart, you would find that this corresponds to the Rat month, Tiger day, and Horse hour, so you would need to read the chapters for each individual sign in order to get a comprehensive forecast for the year. Read the “Astrology Overview” for additional information about the integration and interaction of the four personal signs.

To find the sign associated with your birth year, month, day, and hour follow the chart in this book, remembering that the lunar year starts in February. According to this lunar calendar, February is the first moon, and December is the 11th moon. In the same way, the days of the month are assigned a number, except that there are only 12 animal signs so only days one through 12 are matched with their respective numbers. For the days 13 through 31, reduce the two digits to one number by adding them together for a single total, which would be the number of that day. For example, the 14th day consists of two numbers, 1 and 4. Adding $1+4=5$, so the 14th day is associated with the number 5, this corresponds to the dragon. To calculate the sign related to the hour of your birth, begin with 11:00PM to 1:00AM, the hour of the Mouse. There are 12 animals and 24 hours in a day, so each animal rules over two hours. The first hour is 11:00PM to 1:00AM, which corresponds to the first sign, the Mouse, and the twelfth hour is 9:00PM to 11:00PM, which corresponds to the twelfth sign, the Boar. To get an accurate reading, you must look up all four signs corresponding to the year, month, day and hour.

This book represents the concerted effort of many people over a period of many years. Master Chang Yi Hsiang spends a great deal of time completing the final edition of this book. Her information is dictated on tapes which are then transcribed onto computer. The manuscript is edited and corrected by her staff under great pressure to present this classical, arcane knowledge in a form that is readily understandable to the modern reader in time for the New Year.

This lengthy and arduous task is undertaken each year by Master Chang Yi Hsiang , her volunteers and her staff, in hopes that this information will help people to overcome their misfortune and make the most of their good fortune. This is an enormous undertaking of many dedicated people. The price of this book does not truly reflect the actual cost, time and labor involved in this task. It is rather a donation to the Tai Hsuan Foundation.
